Mrs. Frost's Class Dojo Guidelines



What is it?

Class Dojo is a classroom management tool I use daily in our classroom. It is projected onto the Smart Board throughout the school day so the students know exactly where they stand for the week. Points are cumulative for the week and can be traded in for Dojo Dollars at the end of each week.

How it works:

For any positive or negative behavior observed, students will be awarded or deducted points. Serious negative behaviors (as deemed by the handbook, teacher, and/or principal) or repeated infractions may also result in a behavior reminder (orange sheet) or possibly a detention.

Dojo Dollars:

At the end of each week, students may trade in any points for Dojo Dollars. Here's how the system works:

- 5 points = \$1
- Exchange points are based on the combined total of positive and negative points. Negative points are deducted from positive points. For example, if a student has 17 positive points and 4 negative points, his or her adjusted point value is 13 points which can be traded in for \$2.
- For every Dojo dollar earned, I also give the same amount of "Concordia Cash".
- The students can use dollars to buy coupons for various items or privileges.
- All dollars and coupons earned are the responsibility of the students! No refunds or replacements will be provided!
